

By flipping the script in this way, I'm hoping that it prods us to look at those with non-communicative disorders and disabilities in a new light. What's happening in a person's mind is unknowable, and the play is an attempt at leveling the playing field in some way, giving someone without a voice a chance to speak up, while also respecting the tough realities that parents and care-takers sometimes have to contend with.

I'm really grateful to have taken this leg of the journey with Lisa and Ground Floor Theatre, and look forward to continuing to think about and work on similar subject matter in the future.


